A GUIDE FOR CANDIDATES

Immigration Application Process



All provincial immigration programs are managed by Nova Scotia Labour, Skills and Immigration (LSI). Determine which program and stream works for you.

NOVA SCOTIA NOMINEE PROGRAM

Get a job offer (if required).

You gather required documents, including documents from your Nova Scotia employer (if required).

You submit your complete application to LSI.

If you are interested in one of Nova Scotia's entrepreneur streams, please contact our office.

You receive nomination from LSI.

ATLANTIC IMMIGRATION PROGRAM

Get a job offer.

Verify that your Nova Scotia employer is designated.

You contact a settlement service organization for a settlement plan.

You provide your employer with required documents.*

Employer submits endorsement application to LSI.

LSI endorses position.



With support from your employer, you may be eligible to apply to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) for a temporary work permit.



You apply for permanent residency from IRCC.

You settle in Nova Scotia.
